# **Accepting Gifts**

GENERALLY, ADVOCATES SHOULD NOT ACCEPT GIFTS. SERVICES ARE FREE AND DONE SO WITHOUT EXPECTATION OF ANYTHING IN RETURN.

Gift giving is an ancient and universal way to express gratitude, appreciation, altruism and love. Rejecting a gift may mean a rejection or disrespect to an individual who's culture stresses hospitality. Thank you gifts are an acknowledgement of your role, but keep in mind that the survivor has done all the work.
